library has an enviable collection of books, print journals, periodicals magazines and

newspapers covering all parameters in the field of "Education" as well as "Teacher's

Training Programme", and books of general interest.

The college also subscribes to electronic resources through UGC INFLIBNET N-

LIST Programme where users can access to more than 6000+ journals and 31,35,000+ e-

books. The library has a good collection of non-book materials too. Research Journal

section provides an appropriate environment for literature survey and research review.

Access to OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facilitates the search service of entire library collection with various search fields like author, title, publisher, subject headings, etc. It also provides multilingual search strategy for retrieval of documents.

Library work is obligatory for the students. In the library both lending and reference facilities are available. There are some library rules to follow strictly. However well-trained and helpful library staff helps in efficient working of the library. Reprographic facility is available to students and staff at the library.
